Please join us for our favorite event of the year. Good food, fun, and fellowship, our **famous silent auction**, and a special musical performance by **Mike Keale**.





A Buddhist Sangha Obon Service started things off at 4:00pm under HPV's bodhi tree, a new tradition here at the village. Food booths opened up afterward, with Korean BBQ beef plates and charsiu chicken plates selling briskly, along with old favorites such as bentos, Chinese noodles, fried rice, spam musubi, and sushi of all types.


